Speakers



Rev Tim Costello

Tim graduated in law at Monash University in 1978. In 1979 he practised as a solicitor in family and criminal law and in 1981, travelled to Switzerland where he studied theology. Tim was ordained a Baptist Minister in 1986. As elected Mayor of St Kilda Council in 1993, he became well-known for championing the cause of local democracy. In 1995 Tim was appointed a Minister of the Collins Street Baptist Church and the Executive Director of Urban Seed, a Christian not-for-profit organisation created in response to concern about homelessness,

drug abuse and the marginalisation of the city's street people. Tim has been the embodiment of Urban Seed's objective to engage society on the critical, moral, spiritual, social and cultural issues of our time. For a number of years now, Tim has been one of Australia's leading voices on issues such as urban poverty, homelessness, problem gambling, reconciliation and substance abuse.



Joe Barnewall

Joe joined Commerce Queensland as Deputy CEO - Business Development in mid August 2002 and became the CEO in October 2002. Prior to joining Commerce Queensland, Joe held a number of other senior positions. Joe has travelled extensively with the World Bank, GRM International and Ministry of Agriculture-Sultanate of Oman.

Dr Onko Kingma

Onko is presently a Director of Capital Agricultural Consultants Pty Ltd (CapitalAg), based in Canberra and aimed at providing analytical help and advice in areas of agriculture, natural resource management and rural growth and development. Until 1999, Dr Kingma held the position of Assistant Secretary, Rural Policy and Communications Division, Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry, Canberra, with direct responsibilities to Ministers in areas of economic, environmental and social policies for rural areas. He is presently involved in the development of water resources policies and sustainable farming systems for the Murray Darling Basin.



Tin Hta Nu

Tin was part of the Burmese resistance and member of the Burmese Women's Union. For the past 8 years Tin has held the position of Deputy Director, Aung Min Gala P/L, Australia (Training & Consulting Company) and has a Master of Economics Degree. Tin has worked for major international aid organisations in the areas of gender analysis, resource ownership and poverty alleviation.





The Hon Mark Vaile, MP

Mark is the Deputy Leader of the National Party, Federal Minister for Trade and holds the Federal seat of Lyne located on the Mid North Coast of New South Wales. Mark has been a member of the National Party of Australia since 1978. In 1984 he became Secretary of the National Party's Lyne Electorate Council. In March 1993, Mark was elected as the Federal Member for Lyne. In 1994 he became Deputy National Party Whip. From 1995 to 1997 he served as a Member of the Speakers Panel. Mark is currently negotiating a Bilateral Free Trade Agreement with the USA.

Sheridan Dudley

Sheridan was appointed General Manager, Camden Council in 1998. Previously she was Director Strategy at Warringah Council. She has degrees in Arts and Law, a postgraduate diploma in Criminology and an MBA. Before moving to Local Government in 1996, Sheridan was a Director in the NSW Premier's Department where she designed and implemented the whole of the government public sector reform agenda. Sheridan has held senior executive positions in government in Industrial Relations, Community Services and Consumer Affairs.

Jack Beetson

Jack is the Executive Director, of the Co-operative for Aborigines Ltd at Tranby Aboriginal College, Glebe. Jack has long been an admired and much respected member of the NSW Aboriginal community. Jack was given international recognition when he was awarded the Unsung Hero Award 2001 by the United Nations in the Year of Dialogue Among Civilisations, one of only 12 people throughout the world to receive such an award.



Ian Oxenford

For the past 8 years Ian has held the position of Managing Director, Aung Min P/L, Australia (Training & Consulting Company). Ian has provided training in developing countries including training needs assessment, human resource development, capacity building, project cycle management, rural development, development economics, development banking, micro-enterprise development and poverty alleviation.

Margaret Allison

Margaret is the Director-General of the Department of Ageing, Disability and Home Care in NSW, one of the largest agencies in the State. With more than 25 years in the public sector (mostly in Queensland), her experience is largely in the human services field, including social policy, child protection, juvenile justice, legal aid and disability. Her professional interests include the reform of service delivery systems, equity and access, social policy and place management.



Paul Henshall

Paul completed his MBA majoring in e-commerce through Ballarat University at the end of 2002. In September 2002 he was approached to take on the role of Project Manager for a new organisation called B-central Incorporated. B-central is a joint initiative of Local Government, State Government, private enterprise and the local community to facilitate information, services, supports, enterprise, recreation and 'all things youth' into a single resource centre. 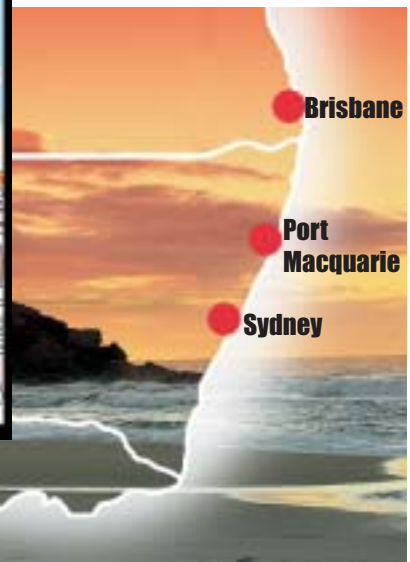
